

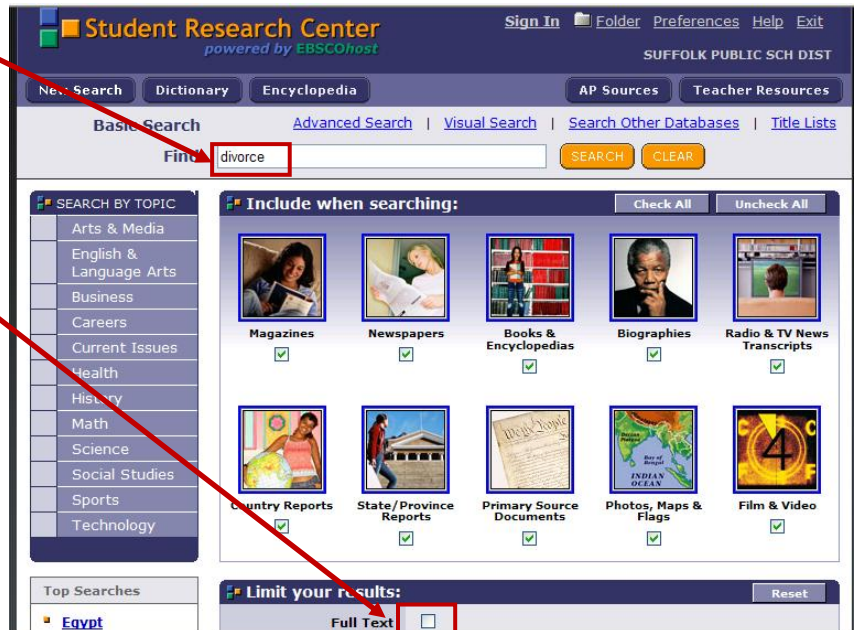

4. Click on the link of an article that you would like to view.



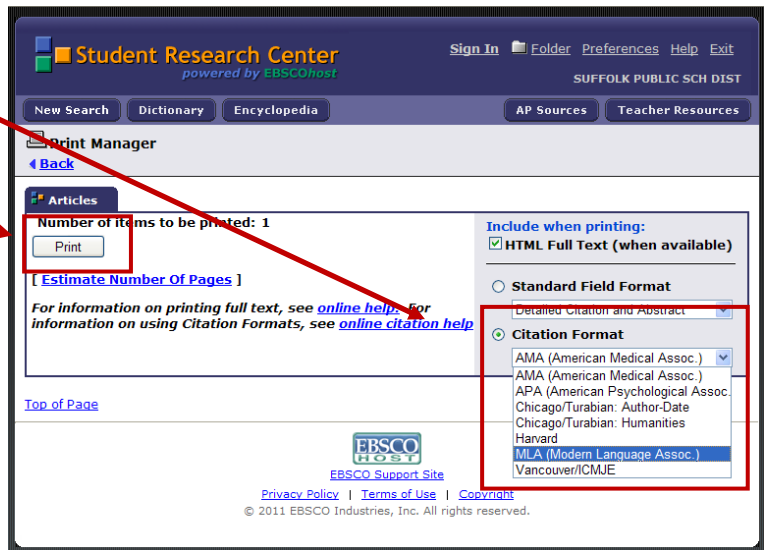
5. In order to view the Citation for the Works Cited page or Bibliography cards, click on the Print option.



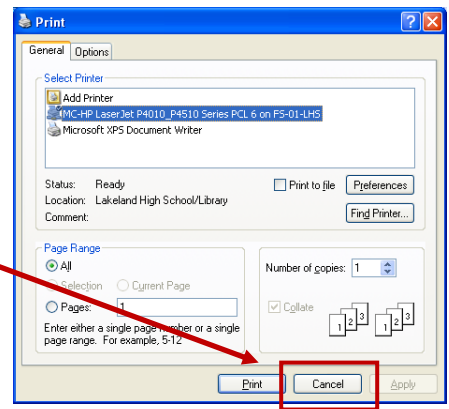
