- ➤ **Program reports** Brief Reports were made on activities that have been completed in the various levels. Highlights were:
 - o Elementary K-2 services/ Elementary QUEST an explanation of 2nd grade screening
 - o Elementary Talented Music and Art an indication of what the testing for talented art entails and a notice of the STARS program which is upcoming for the music students.
 - o Middle School QUEST 6-8 The middle school presented a short video highlighting activities they managed during the semester.
 - O Advanced Instruction 9-12 The board was reminded of the three high school programs which students can apply for as specialty programs. In addition, there was mentioned that the PSAT information was disseminated which leads to AP potential. An emphasis was placed on making sure that juniors sit for the PSATs.
 - o Supervisor's Report The Governor's School programs were again mentioned.

We broke into the two sessions for the community seminars:

Using Gifted Teaching Techniques at Home facilitated by the middle school GRTs in the media center or How to Prepare My Child for the Gifted Assessments facilitated by the elementary GRTs in the cafeteria. There were approximately 25 adults and their children in the former and 30 adults and their children in the latter. Eighteen surveys were completed. The surveys revealed:
